Approach

Our film unfolds through the eyes of Rose; a small lady with a great big personality. Rose's amusing narration lends the film it's sense of humour, creating a connection with our audience through the confident comments she casts upon a series of family 'fails.'

The approach aims to bring a fresh perspective to Worcester Bosch - lending production value through a bold visual style, humour through characterful casting and eye-catching attention via an edit filled with punch.

We will cast a cinematic lens over the script - elevating the familiar domestic setting to a place that will live long in the memory.





Shoot Considerations

Our shoot will take place on location over the course of two concurrent days in January.

The setting - a typical British family home - will form a characterful yet realistic backdrop to the film.

The majority of our film will take place in around our chosen house though a small number of choice locations - nearby - will provide a sense of the world beyond the four walls of home.

The home will act as our - providing us the freedom to capture spontaneous moments. Our cast will be encouraged to ad-lib and improvise, bringing an extra layer of reality. Rose will also occasionally break the fourth wall further enhancing her connection with the audience.

Our set will be a happy one...





Meet the Worcesters...

Our cast - the Worcesters - are a stereotypical family from an anonymous town somewhere in middle England.

Introducing... Mum & Dad - Laura and Geoff, their two children - Jenny & Rose, Granddad (who lives next door), the family dog, Rothko (who lives under the table) and (when Jenny permits) Jenny's boyfriend Jake.

The Worcesters reflect the target market and its through their relateable family dynamic that the film forges a bond with it's audience.

Our film acts as a snap-shot into the lives and routines of the family, offering an insight into each family member's quirks and characteristics

Through its humorous approach the film builds a rapport between the Worcesters and the Worcester Bosch public.





Mum Laura is a typical working mum, full of love for her family and passion for her profession (as a nurse). She's the back-bone of the household.

Geoff - a Worcester Bosch engineer by trade - is a spritely character with a cracking smile. His main loves in life are his family and his rugby team - though the order of priority is prone to change.



Big Sister

Jenny recently left school and has just started her first job at Top Shop. She's a strong influence on Rose; a figure for her younger sister to look up to, a fountain of (boy band related) knowledge and passionate opinion (not all good).

She loves her sister dearly, though doesn't always share that fact with Rose...

Boyfriend Jake is a loveable young man who simply can't do right for doing wrong. As hard as he tries to make his girlfriend happy he's constantly putting his foot in it and having to say 'sorry.'

The Things...

From domestic appliances that give-up to people who let you down, our film explores the many ways in which 'things' in life can - and do - go wrong.

Our film contains a series of humorous and relatable scenes of something (or someone) going wrong...

The middle of our film contains a quick-cut sequence of these moments, cramming a series of 'fails' into a short space of time to add serious impact.

Through Rose and her commentary we share the common understanding that there's not much you can do about it - but laugh.







Location

Our location is a typical British suburban home. Somewhere friendly and familar. Somewhere filled with life, energy and colour at all times of the day. Somewhere called home.









Shooting Style

Our shooting style draws influence and inspiration from cinema, using a combination of well known techniques to elevate the look of film above the normality of it's domestic setting.

We will use anamorphic lenses and dramatic framing to add scale and visual interest.

In combination we will often favour wide angle close-ups of our characters to gain a sense of their personality.

Naturalistic lighting will lend a sense of reality, whilst occasionally shooting hand-held will allow us to feel a part of selected scenes. This look will be enhanced in our grade.

For our quick-cut montage of 'fails' we will shoot at a high frame rate (in slow-mo) to highlight the drama of each moment in detail.
